Christians have never had a problem with learning, knowing, and sharing their wisdom with oth-



(1 Timothy 1:6-7)

"Ignorance is bliss," they say; but I say, "Ignorance is unjustified." Though, Jesus said it best, "and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free." (John 8:32)

TREASURER'S REPORT

For the first five months of 2010 we have collected \$124,574 towards our 2010 budget of \$345,020. As of the end of May our bills have totaled \$214,695.82 while the money deposited to cover these bills is \$194,878.18 making a shortage of \$19,817.64 between the moneys deposited and the bills paid. This included the \$4,372.00 difference between the cost of the roof of \$58,372.00 and the C/D of \$54,000.00 that was cashed to cover this expense.

EMORY GROVE HYMN SING

The 36th Annual Hymn Sing at Emory Grove, Glyndon, MD begins in July. The Emmanuel UMC Chancel Choir is scheduled as the special guests at the July 14th Hymn Sing. We will leave the Emmanuel parking lot at 5:00 p.m. to drive to Emory Grove, about an hour drive. We have reserved the Hotel dining room for a potluck (bring a dish to share) and then we will attend the Hymn Sing in the Tabernacle at 7:30 p.m. Plan to come and support our choir members as they are the special performers at the Hymn Sing, and pick your favorite hymn to sing. We should arrive back at Emmanuel by about 10:30 p.m.

Emory Grove in a 143-yearold Methodist camp meeting ground that has held summer religious services since 1868. The Hymn Sings were begun in 1974 by Rev. George Lovell, Kathy Mellott's grandfather. Rev. Lovell started the Hymn Sings because he felt that worship one day a week is not enough. Praising God in the middle of the week is a spiritually uplifting experience, especially in the open-air Tabernacle at Emory Grove. Other activities planned this summer include a Choir Fest hosted by Blango Ross, with Concert and Dinner scheduled for July 31st, and an Afternoon Tea scheduled for 3:00 p.m. - 5:00 p.m. on August 7th. There is a Hymn Sing every Wednesday evening during the summer at 7:30 p.m. and a Worship service, featuring a different church, every Sunday evening at 7:30 p.m. All of these events and services are open to the public!

The Mellotts have a cottage at Emory Grove, built in 1920. They spend many weekends in the summer at Emory Grove, which epitomizes the Bible verses, "Come ye apart from the madding world," and may you hear a soft voice



EMERGE has an affiliation with DBSA, (Depression Bipolar Support Alliance), a national mental health organization. Our Support Group is listed on the DBSA website and we are the only group in the area at this time. I think it's important to realize that this ministry extends beyond our own church and community, but serves at least one person as far as one hour from Emmanuel. EMERGE plans special educational programs during Mental Health Month in May and Mental Illness Awareness Week in October. So, we need to pray about this and other timely considerations used for spreading the gospel to our neighbors in the Beltsville community. Rev. Mejia's article in the June Lamplighter makes his point very clearly; that as Christians, we need to pray, read our Bible daily, tithe and expect

to make a commitment to follow Christ in service and in sacrificial giving.


Fall Confirmation Class
